



Coagulation Research Grant | 2017

About the Grant

Aniara Diagnostica's Coagulation Research Grant provides \$20,000 for established investigators (eg – faculty at an academic institution) and for students/trainees to do innovative coagulation/hematology research. Deadline for receipt of application is November 1, 2017.

The Aniara Research Panel awards one yearly \$20,000 grant for specialized coagulation/hematology research. All proposed projects must be in the coagulation/hematology scientific field of interest.

Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome

This year, we're asking for projects that deal specifically with EDS — Ehlers-Danlos syndrome — and its effects on hemostasis and thrombosis. Extensive bruising, spontaneous arterial rupture, rupture of hollow organs, and severe internal bleeding are predominant features in EDS. Patients suffering from such syndromes typically undergo hematological studies including evaluation of clotting factors, platelet aggregation, and bleeding time.

Aniara has a passionate interest in this research because one of our own family suffers from EDS. We hope the grant will be used to spread awareness of this disease and address its specific issues within the hemostasis and coagulation fields.

Funding

Funding is restricted to North America, South America, Latin America, and Nordic countries. This grant program does not pay educational tuition, nor does it offer scholarships or fellowships of any kind.

Eligibility

Applications are expected to have advanced degrees (PhD or equivalent) and be associated with an educational organization or institution. Independent researchers or those pursuing a PhD-level degree may apply, but awards to non-PhD applicants are rare. As a general rule, all applicants are expected to have published a minimum of three articles in peer-reviewed scientific journals.

Amount

Aniara Diagnostica will award on \$20,000 grant recipient per year.

Restrictions

Aniara Coagulation Research Grants may not be used for indirect costs, overhead, and other expenses not directly related to the project. Fringe benefits are also excluded, as are salaries.

Funds may not be used for travel to scientific/professional meetings or conferences, legal actions, land acquisition, endowments, construction of permanent field stations, or publishing research results.
